Substeps in writing

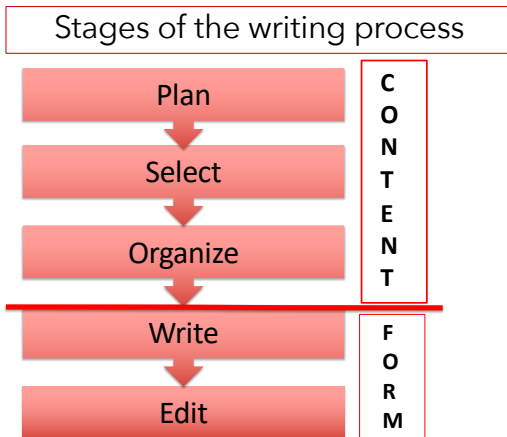
find main message(s)
select relevant content
consider different storylines
identify main idea for each paragraph

write first draft



make key sentences stand out
connect paragraphs
achieve cohesion and flow
edit for brevity, clarity, preciseness
check grammar, spelling, punctuation
